- Click Find My School and search for Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools and click This is my school
- Click green button to sign in and log in with NCEdCloud to get to Clever
- Add Charlotte-Mecklenburg Public Library and NC Kids Digital Library for more titles (use Student ID # to sign in to each of these libraries; only need to sign in once)
- When searching for a book, make sure the box for Search all my libraries is checked
- In Preferences, limit Audience to Juvenile for elementary age
